I also raised the issue of almost all the new trees planted as part of the A14 upgrade project having died - there needs to be proper oversight and enforcement of the planning requirements.

Finally, we talked about all the action the Government is taking to tackle the disgusting problem of sewerage overflows into rivers. Glad to welcome today's announcement of the largest overhaul of the sewer system to tackle storm sewage discharges and improved monitoring of sewage spills to drive enhanced environmental protection and enforcement!

Held on Monday 9th May at 7.30
Chairman's report Steeple Morden Parish Council May 2022

A year when some normality returned, we for the first time in a long while have been able to hold meetings in person. This does lead to better debates, and more open governance.

There have been the usual issues to deal with this year, planning, speeding, litter, repairs, finance, trees, technology

On planning, whilst there have been some controversial applications, I believe your council has dealt with them fairly, impartially and has listened to the various arguments. It should always be remembered that we as a parish council do not have the power to grant or refuse applications, we can only recommend, and our decisions have to follow certain guidelines.

Speeding is a perennial problem in the village, we now have two speed signs, new village gateways, together with enhanced 40 mph areas. We are looking for evidence to apply for grants to extend these limits, particularly in Odsey and down North Brook End. Speed at the school is a particular concern, we have raised this with highways, who are the decision makers, but have had no success. We will apply for the twenty is plenty signs to be placed in that area as soon as possible. Keith Austin is our very capable lead in this.

Litter, it is amazing how much litter is picked up by the volunteers, we are grateful to all who help, and particularly Ginny Belson, who arranges it all.

Repairs. A quiet year, however we are in the process of getting quotes, for resurfacing the car park, and repairing the reading room. The Reading room is of particular concern as the roof needs major repair, we have a choice to make, do we make do and mend? Or do we together with the sports clubs investigate a replacement building. This has to be sports club led, as only they can judge whether the present facilities are suitable now and for the future.

Finance. Our finances are in good health, we have operated, for some years now, with a modest surplus, this will enable us to fund the larger repairs now needed, and to make a substantial contribution to a new sports facility if that is what is required. In our opinion it is far better to operate the budget in this way rather than having to borrow money when large items come up.

Trees, thanks to Nettie Travers Healey for her efforts in arranging for many trees to be planted, and of course to her helpers. This is greatly supported by the parish council and additional funds have been made available again this year.

Technology. We now have a new improved website, and a much more proactive social media presence. Many thanks to Malcolm Bird and Nick Badger for their work in these fields.

I am very grateful for all the support and help from the parish councillors, most have assumed responsibility for certain areas of the parish business and without whom the parish certainly wouldn't run as well. We have two members leaving us Ginny Belson and Sacha Wheatley. I would like to personally thank them for all their help, and hope that when their time permits they may rejoin. Sean Travers Healey did not stand for re-election but has agreed to be co-opted on, this is excellent news particularly for his great knowledge in planning.

We are two councillors short of a full complement, please apply if you are interested , Lastly our other helpers, Sally our clerk has again been invaluable, she makes sure we follow the rules, quietly gets all our correspondence done and monitors our finances all without fuss.

Sebastian and Heather our council and district councillors, again have been very supportive of our village, both of them get things done and are always prepared to help, for which we are grateful.

We have a great village, made more so by all the people who volunteer. throughout the village for various tasks, if anyone feels they can help in any way, please contact the relevant organisation, where I am sure you will be warmly welcomed.

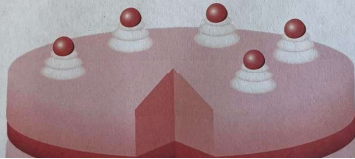

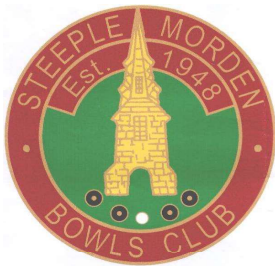
