Notes taken at the Parish Council Meeting on 11th July, held in the Cricket Pavilion

<u>Jubilee Award 2022 -</u> The Jubilee Award was presented to Mike Smith, in recognition of many years' involvement with the Village Hall, and Village.

<u>District Councillor</u> Heather Williams reported that everything including green bin emptying seemed to be running smoothly. All potholes had been reported and most had been filled in.

<u>County Councillor</u> Sebastian Kindersley reported that the East/West rail consultation had now included the northern counties and a statement would be made soon.

Gypsy, Roma and Traveller new legislation has not yet been released.

Replacement of Allotment Boundary Fence – specification and replacement to be taken in hand by the Allotmenteers.

<u>Proposal for EV Chargers</u> - it was decided to press ahead with the installation of two EV chargers.

MVAS - Additional poles for Odsey and North Brook End - ongoing.

<u>Bluegrass Festival 2022 and 2023</u> - the 2022 Festival was a great success and the Organisers would like to book again for next year.

<u>Land off Ashwell Road</u> – erection of four detached sheltered Paragraph 80 dwellings with associated hard and soft landscaping, formation of two ponds and re-wilding of land.

REFUSED – outside the village envelope, and encroachment into the countryside.

Planning Ref 22/02425/FUL

<u>Wyndmere Farm, Land at Ashwell Road.</u> Erection of commercial building, extension to existing hardstanding area to allow an increase in site area. Relocation of existing shipping containers, and erection of new boundary fence.

NOT RECOMMENDED - would consider small adjustments, although it was considered to be outside PC planning remit.



Bassingbourn Village Band

Dreams can come true. Back in 1997 Les Houghton dreamt of a village band in Bassingbourn-cum-Kneesworth. Les didn't play an instrument himself, but felt the village was lacking something and would be the better for having a little bit of music at its heart.

Les put a shout out for interested musicians and in January 1998 approximately 8 people and their brass, woodwind, stringed and percussive instruments came together to form the band and make music together. These included triplets on trumpet,

clarinet and violin. The band has been making music ever since. In 2022 it consists of approximately 14 assorted woodwind and brass players on flute, clarinet, saxophone, French horn, tenor horn and trombone, plus a bass guitarist and a cello. There is often a mixture of ages too. Rehearsals take place on Thursday evenings, currently in Litlington, but returning to the Old School, Bassingbourn in the autumn this year. New players are always very welcome. There is no set standard, but a basic level of competence on your instrument and an ability to read music are important.

The band has played for a variety of local events over the years including celebrations to mark the Queen's Golden Jubilee in June 2002, Bassingbourn Village College's 50th Birthday celebrations and the Queen's 2012 Diamond

Jubilee. This year we've helped raise funds for Ukraine and will be playing in a variety of Jubilee celebrations.
