Congestion Charges

More than 3,000 residents across South Cambridgeshire have now signed my petition against congestion charging, and over 12,000 people have signed the change.org petition too. I have surveyed over 2,100 constituents and over 100 businesses - the people have spoken, and they overwhelmingly oppose the planned congestion charge. It needs to be scrapped.

But the GCP still isn't listening. They are currently promoting their plan, barely mentioning it is contingent on a £5 a day, +£1000 per year tax on ordinary people -mums and dads taking their kids to school, carers visiting family members, tradesmen with heavy tools, NHS staff, and hospital patients.

If you also oppose the GCPs plan, it is vital that you let them know by completing their online consultation survey.

Although the GCPs consultation asks many vague and loaded questions, Question 9 gives you an opportunity to clearly state your level of opposition to the congestion charge. If you only fill in one question, make sure it is number 9!

The GCP claims that a congestion charge is the only way to pay for local transport improvements - that is simply not true.

Campaigners, representatives, and commentators have pointed out numerous alternatives, many of which have yet to be considered or brought through to public consultation.

I would therefore strongly urge you to "strongly oppose" the congestion charge in the answer to question 9. This will send a simple message to the GCP: stop it now.

I will continue to fight this charge - thank you for joining me!

<u>District Councillor Heather Williams</u>— commented on the availability of help with household bills during the cost of living crisis. <u>Update on EV Charger Installation</u>- the EV Chargers are to be installed soon, with the electricity sourced from the Bowls Club.

<u>Children's Play Area</u> - Cllr Nick Badger is overseeing repairs and general maintenance.

<u>Steeple Morden Magpies - Agreement/Maintenance of Pitches</u>- a draft legal agreement is to be drawn up

<u>CCC</u> Request for position for replacement trees following removal of Whitebeams on <u>Cheyney Street</u> - the Parish Council would like a report as to why the trees are to be removed.

<u>Pavilion Spring-clean</u> – the pavilion is to be cleaned ready to provide a 'warm hub' during the winter.

<u>SCDC Six Free Trees</u> - a discussion was held with Nettie Traverse-Healey concerning tree plantings around the village. SCDC has gifted 6 trees and it was suggested that they be planted near the children's' play area. 

What is Maggie's? Maggie's provides practical and emotional support to those with cancer, their family, friends and carers. The centre is a warm and welcoming place, with qualified cancer support specialists offering an evidence-based free programme of support which complements medical treatment.

Practical support includes information about eating well, coping with hair loss, or empowering visitors with information about their cancer treatment and benefits entitlements. Or visitors can talk to our psychologists and counsellors, explore their creative side through Art Therapy or get help to manage stress.

Then there is our kitchen table which is at the heart of our centre; a place where visitors can sit and chat with others in a similar situation, or maybe just take some quiet time with a cup of tea.

Examples of support can be anything from Art Therapy to Yoga, Men's Support Group to Menopause workshop, Living with Prostate Cancer to Brain Tumour Support Group. In addition, a cancer support specialist is always available for a chat and to listen. They will always meet a new visitor, help them decide what support best suits their needs and make the appropriate referrals.
