#### ASHWELL & BASSINGBOURN SURGERY

Dear Patients,

As many of you are aware we have recently introduced a new way of assessing requests for medical appointments. As promised, we said we would monitor this change and make amendments as necessary. We have listened to your feedback, especially regarding routine appointment requests and from tomorrow will be making some changes.

Effective from 23rd April 2024, you will be able to access our online request for an appointment form from 7am in the morning until 3pm (no restrictions). This change will make it easier for those patients working full time to submit their medical request. We will aim to respond to forms submitted by 13.00, on the same day however, if you submit after this time we will aim to respond as soon as possible.

If you submit your form between 13.00-15.00 and you believe your problem is urgent please follow up your form submission with a call to the Surgery, so that we can find your request and highlight this to the GP.

After 3pm, if you have a medical emergency, please call the Surgery on 01462 417377.

Medical requests will now filter through two layers of triage.

Level 1 - Care Navigation. Depending on your clinical symptoms, you may be directed to others services, such as the local pharmacy, first contact mental health, or first-contact physiotherapy.

Level 2 - GP Triage. If your medical concern cannot be safely signposted at level 1, your medical request will be passed to a GP to review the urgency of your request and we will communicate this with you. We hope that the above changes will be welcomed by patients but please do continue to provide feedback, as this allows us the opportunity to make positive change.

# Parish Council Annual Parish Meeting

<u>Presentation of the Queen's Jubilee Award</u> - the 2023 award was presented to **Andrew Holt**.

### Chairman's Statement

Having decided to retire as parish council chairman after several years this will be my last report, I apologise for not being here in person

Finance, the parishes finances are in a robust position, thanks to the whole council being prudent with expenditure, whilst ensuring there is sufficient to keep improving facilities.

Improvements, we now have electric car charging points, a resurfaced car park, free Wi-Fi shortly to be extended to the church, some outdoor exercise equipment and, if well used I suspect more will be installed plus a climbing wall coming .

Environment we have an annual budget for tree planting and over the last two years have had many trees planted . I should add the village is blessed with some beautiful meadows and walks .

Recreation ground and play area, our parish councillors who look after this area do a fantastic job keeping it all maintained often doing the repairs themselves ,

Reading room, this is of great concern, we have had reports on it . The reading room is nearing the end of its life, and the cost of repairs and improvements to make it of sufficient standard are very high . So much so that the Parish Council after much debate is very reluctant to do the work . A far better solution is a new building part funded by the FA, helped by the PC.

Planning, most months we have applications to consider, we try to do this in a fair and equitable manner, I should point out that the PC,s decision is purely a recommendation, we do not have the power to grant or refuse applications. Although I hope that our decision is taken into account.

Litter. Thanks to all the team who pick it up and to the organiser, I am disappointed that so much litter is dropped, we live in a beautiful village, and there is no need to spoil it.

Speed, another concern, we have gateways and, speed monitors, all recommended by highways, whilst the average speed has dropped there are still some people who take no notice whatsoever .A particular concern of parishioners is the speed by the school. We have applied for this area to be made a 20 mph area.

Potholes, we have been told that the county council for some years adopted a policy of "managed decline" what complete folly. As a council we have lobbied hard for improvements, and some holes have been repaired, we asked if we could repair some and pay for this out of our funds. Unfortunately we are not allowed to do this.

All of the above things, take time and commitment from your Parish councillors, I am extremely grateful for all they do on our behalf. We are very lucky we have a council made up of people with different skill sets, and who are prepared to use them for the common good. I have also been very lucky to have had Sally as our clerk, she quietly gets on with matters, and makes sure we keep to the rules. The newsletter is produced by Desma, again we all should be grateful for her efforts

I wish my successor as chairperson all success with the hope that the council continues to be as fortunate as I have been with the people on it and the people who help





# New portfolio event from *brainstrust*. Part of the 'Take on 10 for brain tumours' series which also includes the *brainstrust* Bass Belle 10 miler.

This is a fast, chip-timed, 'pancake' flat and definitely PB potential race which takes in the picturesque South Cambridgeshire villages of Bassingbourn and Litlington. The race is open to social and club runners. Runners must be at least 15 years old to take part with no upper age limit. The course consists of 7.5km on road and 2.5km off road along a grass track. Part of the course is on private land, so entering the event is your only way of completing the race! With only 500 places, the *brainstrust* Bass Belle 10km is an intimate race meaning runners can get off the start line quickly, and straight into their pacing without feeling bunched up by crowds. Another great plus for those after a PB!

**Free fundraiser entry**: get free entry to the race by agreeing to fundraise for *brainstrust*. Please note that if your fundraising target isn't met you will be required to pay an entry fee on the day.


